# Producing Police Video and Audio Records

BB&amp;K Free Webinar

Police departments in California are now obligated to produce police video and audio files to the public - despite their potentially gruesome and confidential nature. In this Best Best & Krieger LLP webinar, Director of PRA Services and E-Discovery Counsel Christine Wood will discuss Senate Bill 1421 and Assembly Bill 748, both passed last year. These laws alter the way law enforcement agencies must respond to California Public Records Act requests for body and dashboard camera footage, as well as various types of audio files. Participants will learn what images and data are subject to redaction, with a focus on the privacy interests often implicated in these types of records. Also, with AB 748 taking effect on July 1, we'll discuss how these two new laws intersect to create new, and more immediate, disclosure obligations.
